

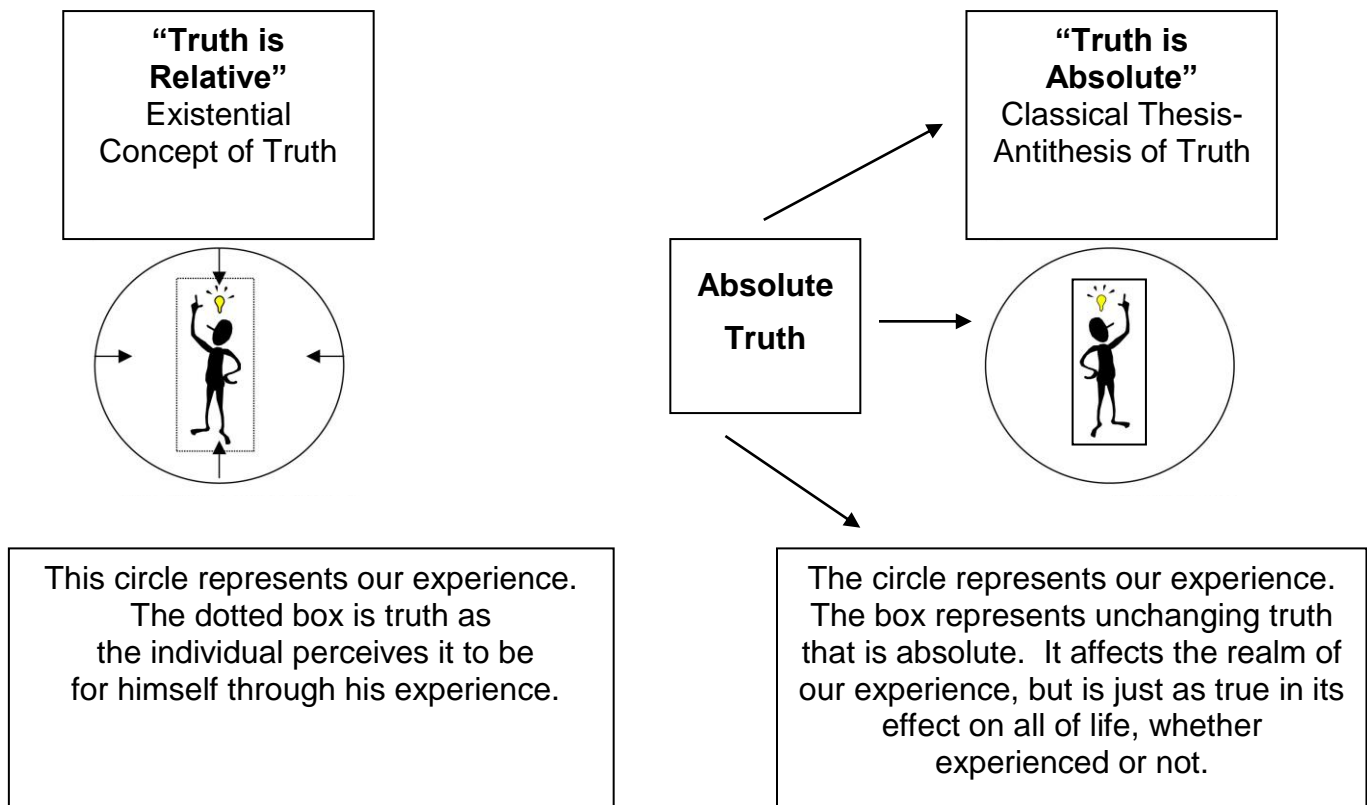

 - ✓ **In Culture** - Escape from Reason and The God Who Is There by Francis A. Schaeffer

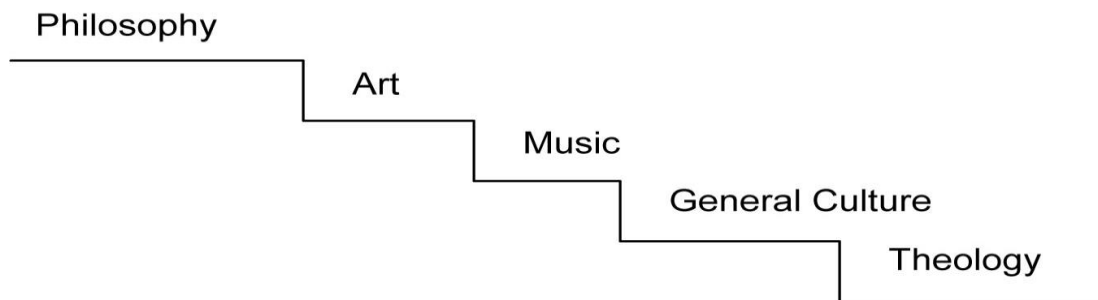
Summarizing the two models of truth:

- **Private Reactions =** “My rights”

Fairness } **Truth is Absolute**
