- Knowledge axiom: Knowledge + Love + Wisdom = \_\_\_\_\_
  - 1. <u>Principle of readiness</u> Only teach children what they are mentally and emotionally capable of learning.
  - 2. <u>Principle of responsibility</u> Never habitually do for your children what they can do for themselves.


