**Why do we make bad job decisions?**

*"Come now, you who say, 'Today or tomorrow, we shall go to such and such a city, and spend a year there and engage in business and make a profit.'"*

James 4:13

**Principle #1:** Make \_\_\_\_\_ the foundation for all decision making.  
James 4:15

**Principle #2:** Recognize the \_\_\_\_\_ of planning apart from God.  
James 4:16

**Principle #3:** Don't buy the \_\_\_\_\_.  
(Upwardly mobile work opportunities are automatically the will of God.)

**Principle #4:** Act on your \_\_\_\_\_ – \_\_\_\_\_ dreams and impulses.  
James 4:17
