A familiar story that is often misunderstood and misapplied.

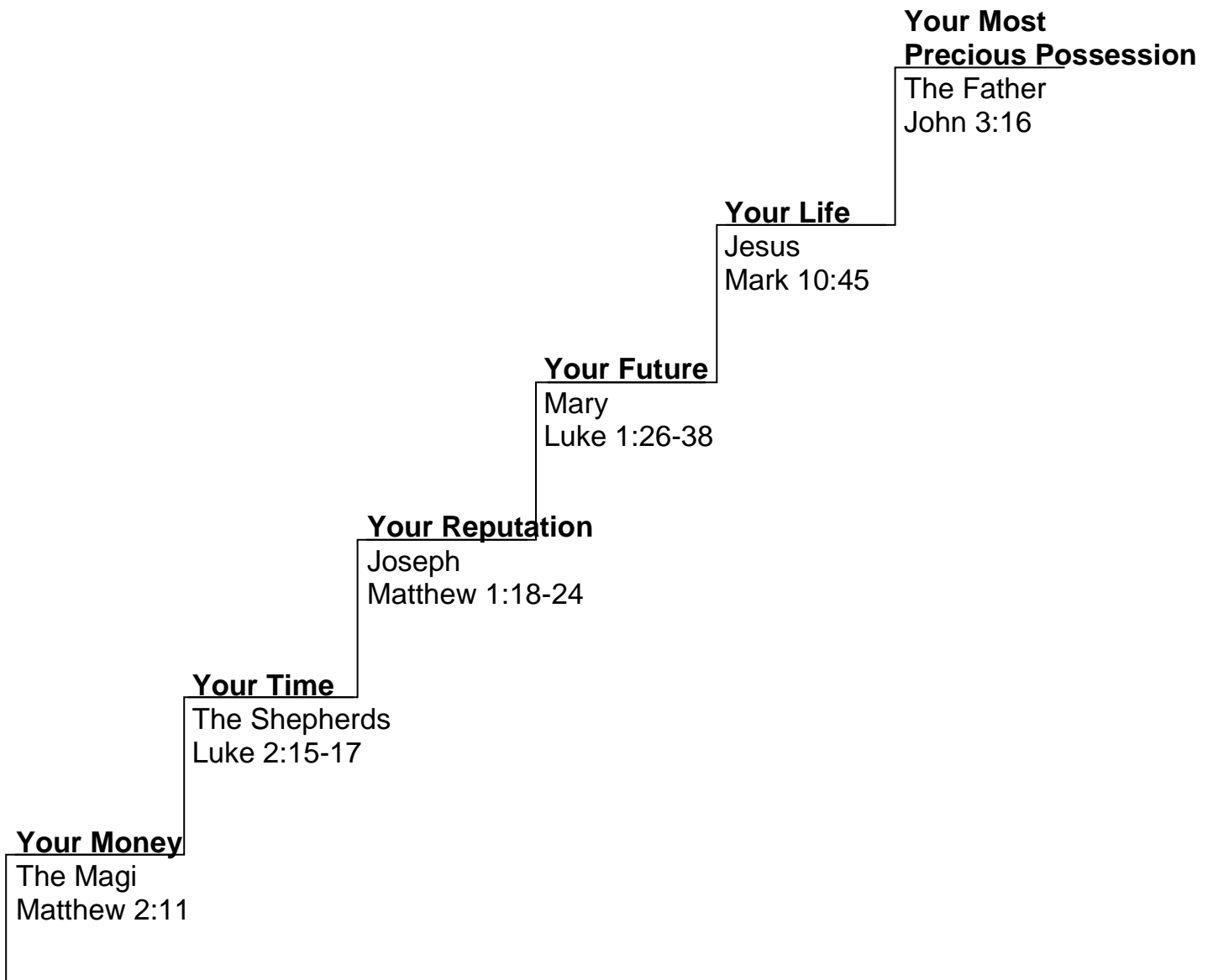
