Matthew 5:17-48 sets forth this King's way of life by contrasting it with the current

interpretation of God's law.

- In each case, Jesus sets forth what **exceeding the righteousness** Matthew 5:20 of the scribes and Pharisees looks like for His Kingdom followers.
- Jesus makes clear that living out His Kingdom values requires a Matthew 7:13-20 **new heart** (Jeremiah 31) and **new power** only He can provide.
- Jesus makes clear that only those with an eternal perspective of Matthew 7:21-33 His sovereignty (final justice) can live this counter-culture lifestyle.
- Jesus makes clear that only through death to personal agendas Matthew 7:24-28 and selfish ambition can this supernatural life that expands His Kingdom be experienced.




